

Paul, Felix, Festus and Agrippa Acts 24:1 – 26:3

1.	Paul was held in custody by Felix for a little over years.		
	a.	Felix apparently found merit in the Jewish accusation.	
	b.	Felix and his wife Drusilla listened to Paul speak about the "faith in Christ Jesus" times. (Ch 24, vs 24)	
	c.	Felix was "afraid" and hoped "Paul would offer him a bribe." (Ch 24, vs 25-26)	
	d.	Felix was, and replaced by Festus, because the people complained to Rome about corruption. (Ch 24, vs 27)	
	e.	As a favor to the Jews, Felix left Paul where he was, in (Ch 24, vs 27)	
	f.	In prison, Paul was <u>under guard</u> , but was also allowed " freedom", as well as to receive "care" from his (Ch 24, vs 23)	
2.	Festus invested the charges, and:		
	a.	Did allow Paul to be set up for an ambush again. (Ch 25, vs 1-5)	
	b.	The Jews again to prove any of their charges to be valid (Ch 25, vs 7)	
	c.	to pass Paul back to the Jews in Jerusalem (Ch 25, vs 9)	
	d.	Paul appealed to Caesar, to which Festus agreed. (Ch 25, vs 12)	
3.	Whe	When King Agrippa arrived:	
	a.	Festus asked for in writing up charges to send to Caesar regarding Paul. (Ch 25, vs 27)	
	b.	Agrippa agreed to hear from Paul directly, in order to help Festus. (Ch 26:1-4)	

For these two + years, we know what Paul was doing, what Rome was doing, and what the Jews were doing, but what was God doing?

Paul:	a.	In custody, being ministered to by his friends, and ministering to them	
	b.	and his testimony, and gospel message, that God had promised he would deliver in Rome.	
	C.	Sharing the gospel and praying for all those around him. (Ch 26, vs 29)	
Roma	ns: a.	Playing	
Jews:	a.	Maintaining their hatred of Paul, marinating in their murderous desires	
	b.	Trying to figure out "The Way" didn't fade out of existence with Paul gone.	
God:	a.	Giving three high ranking Roman officials a chance to	
		and be (Felix, Festus, and Agrippa)	
	b.	Giving the in Jerusalem a chance to repent and be saved.	
	C.	Allowing many people, who would not otherwise be exposed to Paul and his preaching, to hear the gospel. (guards, servants, friends of friends,)	
	d.	Preparing the timing and circumstances of Paul's visit to Rome.
