2.	The sir	The singular, overarching point of this introduction is that Jesus is					
3.	Mark's logic is this:						
	a.	If only God the Son could ever be called "God the Son" by God the Father; and since Jesus was called God the Son by God the Father, then Jesus is of course God the Son. (1:1-11)					
	b.	If only God is able to withstand direct by Satan himself, after fasting for 40 days in the wilderness, then Jesus is God because he did just that. (1:12-13)					
	c.	If only God has the to cast out demons, all demons, and many demons at once; then Jesus is God because he did indeed do exactly these things. (1:21-28, 39, 5:1-20)					
	d.	If only God can absolutely someone from like leprosy, bodily disfigurement, and even paralysis; and Jesus did all these things with 100% success, in public, for everyone who came to him - then Jesus must be God. (1:29-34, 40-45, 2:1-12, 3:1-6)					
	e.	If only God has the to correct false doctrines within Judaism regarding the Sabbath, Clean and unclean rules regarding people of low social standing, and teach a new and true message to the people - all taken directly from the correct understanding of Old Testament scriptures - then Jesus is once again proven to be God. (2:23-28, 3:1-6, 4:1-34)					
	f.	If only God has complete control over creation, the Jesus must be God because even the wind and the waves of the sea his voice. (4:35-41)					
	g.	If only God has the power to raise someone from the Dead, and doesn't even have to be there in person; then Jesus is God, because that's exactly what he does in Mark 5:21-43.
