

**LIST OF CRIMES THAT HAVE BEEN HELD TO INVOLVE MORAL TURPITUDE

The following crimes have been held to be crimes of moral turpitude under the “least adjudicated elements” test unless otherwise indicated (i.e., if finding was based on “conduct” deemed to constitute moral turpitude, we so denote):

Note: It is likely that the definition of moral turpitude in the context of both attorney discipline and immigration cases is narrower than the definition used when determining whether a person can be impeached. Accordingly, we have included a few cases from both those contexts where the court has held the crime to be a crime of moral turpitude but not when the case has come to a contrary conclusion. However, in light of the concerns raised in the California Supreme Court decision of *In re Grant* (2014) 58 Cal.4th 469 that a moral turpitude finding in one context is “not determinative on the issue of moral turpitude” in another context because of the different definitions (*id.* at p. 476), caution should be exercised in relying too heavily on cases other than those directly addressing whether a crime involves moral turpitude for purposes of impeachment.
