Incor	rect Applications from today's text:					
1.	Since Paul's response to these 12 disciples not having received the Holy Spirit was, "Then what Baptism did you receive", we now know there is a special anointing of the					
	Holy Spirit, which comes on believers after the laying on of hands.					
2.	Handkerchiefs and aprons, that touched people after they touched Paul, healed					
	them. Therefore, we can minister to more people by creating spiritually endowed					
	objects and sending them out to as many people as possible. (Benny Hinn's coat, prayer handkerchiefs, prayer circles, prayer chain letters, etc.)

Appli	cation:					
1.	Read and Study the Bible as it was to be read and studied.					

- a. Poetry is inspirational, revealing truth, but is not always literal.
- b. Proverbs are catchy saying, means to make you think, and should not be taken as a promise.
- c. Prophesy is a glimpse into the future, is easily misinterpreted, and should not be the foundation of your beliefs and practices.
- d. History is a narrative that does not tell the whole story, but what it does reveal is factually accurate in every way. Perspective can cause apparent contradiction, but can almost always be explained in simple, easy to understand ways.
- e. Jewish Civil law governed the original nation of Israel, had a purpose, but does not govern modern Israel or us.
- f. Jewish Ceremonial law pointed to a future messiah, and was thus fulfilled by Jesus as the Messiah.
- g. Jewish Moral law is actually God's moral law for all of humanity, and is thus still in effect as our truth source and the standard by which all morality and truth is measured.
- h. Doctrines and Spiritual practices of the Old Testament, although they may look and feel different in the New Testament, have not been abolished or lessened in any way. (Sabbath, Tithe, Marriage)
