

## Acts 4:1-22 Peter and John Get Arrested

## **Context (The Event)**

- 1. The lame beggar had been healed just a matter of minutes earlier.
- 2. The crowd had swarmed to Peter and John to see what had happened.
- 3. Seeing the crowds astonishment and curiosity, Peter began to preach.
  - a. This man was healed by the power of Jesus Christ of Nazareth.
  - b. God allowed Jesus to be crucified, as was prophesied In the O.T.
  - c. God raised Jesus from the dead, as was also prophesied.
  - d. Your only legitimate response to these truths is to repent and be forgiven.
- 4. The people listened and many responded ,with repentance, to Peter's sermon.

## **Things to Notice:**

1.	Peter and John not only proclaimed Jesus' resurrection, but the resurrection of else as well. (Vs 2)							
2.	So far, every time Peter speaks, he reminds them that Jesus was crucified, that He was raised from the dead, and is the source of miraculous power for miracles. (Vs 10)

1.	Our Gospel should include Jesus the, who was crucified, and who also resurrected.							
2.	Most of us are unschooled, ordinary men and women. You have to be a Bible Scholar and/or a Pastor to be used by God in evangelism or anything else.							
3.	If you ever have to choose between an earthly authority and God, that is when it is OK to disobey the Earthly authority. But <i>you better make sure</i> you are obeying God as you disobey man, and be willing to <i>accept whatever consequences</i> come your way.
