- a. The phrase "sanctity of life" reflects the belief that, because people are made in God's image (Genesis 1:26–27), human life has an inherently sacred attribute that should be protected and respected at all times. (Gotquestions.com)
- b. The sanctity of life is the theological or philosophical understanding that all human life has an inherent dignity, worth and sacredness that sets it apart from all other beings within the world. This perspective does not assert that human life is sacred in the sense of being divine, but that its very essence is distinct within the biological world and of incalculable worth, thus warranting protection throughout the course of its entire existence. - c. The sanctity of life simply means all human life is sacred. This sacredness is not a reflection of the goodness or holiness of man, because we are sinful. It reflects the origin of man because we were all created in the image of God. (Biblestudytools.com)
- d. Sanctity means the quality of being **holy, sacred, or set apart**. Believing in the sanctity of life means believing that human life is somehow holy, set apart, or different from other life forms. (compellingtruth.org)
