Numbers 14:31 "As for your **children (little ones)** that you said would be taken as plunder, I will bring in to enjoy the land you have rejected.

- Whenever God numbered the people for a census or for military reasons (adult responsibilities), He counted the men who were 20 years old and older.
 (Exodus 38:26; Numbers, chapter 1; II Chronicles 31:17)
- c. In Ezra 3:8 "Levites twenty years old and older" were appointed to supervise the building of the house of the Lord. (Levites were not allowed to serve as priests until 25)
