(Bethlehem, Egypt, and Nazareth were seemingly contradictory prophecies)
 - b. The event of ***his birth was marked*** by Angels (Luke 2), A Star (Matthew 2:2), Magi (Matthew 2:1-9), and an assassination attempt (Matthew 2:16-18)
 - c. For the first time ever, God himself took on the form of a _____ (Phil 2:6-8)

Big Idea:

If Jesus were truly the Son of God, taken on human flesh, from infancy through adulthood, then we would expect his birth to be miraculous and marked in history, that he would have supernatural abilities over both the physical and spiritual worlds, that his message would be wonderful, complete, life changing, and world impacting, that he would achieve something no one else has ever or will ever achieve, and that he would have power over life and death.

And that's **exactly what Jesus was, said, and did.** There is no doubt Jesus is God the Son.
