

# Acts 1:12-17, 20b-26 Judas' Replacement

### Why did God do that?

- Why does God give *instruction* for divorce in Deuteronomy 24:1-4, say He *hates* divorce in Malachi 2:16, and give us the *grounds* for Biblical divorce in Matthew 5:32?
- 2. Why, in I Samuel 8, did God *warn* Israel that they did not want a king, and that even asking for a king was in fact *rejecting God* Himself as their ruler, when He had already given them, in Deuteronomy 17:14-20 *instructions* on how to choose a king, his necessary *credentials*, and a partial *job description*.
- 3. Why did God *create* a redemption plan for man, *before* creation (I Peter 1:20) when he was going to create Adam and Eve in perfection, and give them very simple instructions that would ensure their ongoing perfect, if they simply followed them.
- ANSWER: Because He knew that men and women would \_\_\_\_\_\_ divorce as a get out of the marriage free card, the Israelites would \_\_\_\_\_\_ for a king even though God himself was already ruling them, and man would \_\_\_\_\_\_ to sin even though they had a perfect relationship with God in the Garden.
