START PRAYING: The Key Issue of Loyalty

We are to realize that God works through people, including our church and national leaders (Proverbs 21:1; Romans 13). God uses others to carry His plan to us and those around us. Therefore, loyalty is also a demonstration of our obedience to our country, civil leaders, church, teachers, authority figures, and family (unless they give a command that goes against God's Word). It is something we demonstrate both in public and in private. Loyalty is a character that puts a portion of love (agape) into action for those others in your life. It may be the one key aspect, seen in you by others, that will point them to God's love!
