His mom is in an assisted living facility, and he told me he that he went to what was supposed to be a resident and family night dinner at the facility. There were about 30 residents at the dinner, and he was the only family member there that night. The other family members who were invited did not show up. I told him how typical that is in Nursing Homes and Assisted Living facilities. Unfortunately, most family members rarely show up to visit or be there for them. Usually the family member will show up for some type of emergency, but to come and regularly visit is another matter.

About 3 years ago at Christmastime, Shelly gave one lady at an Assisted Living facility a Christmas card after our church service. She cried on her shoulder for quite some time as she told her how she had always been there for her children, always invited them to Christmas, Thanksgiving, and birthday celebrations, and had cooked big meals for them. But now, they never came to see her. They never invited her to Christmas or any other family gatherings and she would be alone for Christmas again this year as usual.

Statistics say that about 70% of Nursing Home residents never have any family members who come to visit or do anything for them. I knew the statistics, but I was shocked to hear that out of 30 residents that came to a family night dinner, only one family member showed up.

Those Who Cannot Repay

..But when you give a banquet, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind, and you will be blessed. Although they cannot repay you, you will be repaid at the resurrection of the righteous.” (Luke 14:13-14)

Jesus spoke of inviting those in need to “His banquet” and then went on to teach a parable describing the many that made excuses to why they would not accept the invitation (**Luke 14:16-24**). The riches of the material world can be a blessing, but many times they become a curse. Our self-reliance and dependence on physical things often blinds us to our true spiritual needs—not to mention the desperate need of others.

Two weeks ago, I was teaching a class in a drug and alcohol detoxification unit and I could not help but notice a man sitting beside me sobbing and unable to lift his head. After the class, he approached me and handed me a note. He could not look me in the eyes and walked away before I could respond. His note read as follows:

“Sir, I have lost everything. I don’t have a place to stay and my shoes are worn out and won’t stay on my feet. I have no clothes or undergarments. I am not asking you for money, but could you please help me find some clothes? I wear large t-shirts and 34 pants. I wear a size 10 shoe. Thank you for any help you can give me. Please pray for me that God will help me?”

It took less than \$25 dollars to get him some shoes and clothes, which we made sure the staff at the facility gave to him. We found out later that that day when he was being released back to the streets with nowhere to go, a local mission unexpectedly contacted them and offered to take the man in. The nurses said, “That never happens,” but we know that with God all things are possible.

Please pray with us that God uses the circumstances in this man’s life to turn Him to truth and salvation.

Testimony of Adopting a Nursing Home Resident

My friendship with Liz

Several years ago my husband and I suffered the tragic loss of both his parents and my father within a 6 week period of time. Stunned by grief for several years, we worked through that and life moved forward. However, in time, I came to realize that something was really amiss by not having any parents for which to care: parents or grandparents to visit on special holidays; to call and ask them about a family recipe; to ask them something about family history. That piece of my life was gone, as my mother had also died some years back. I'm sharing this to let you know why I reached out to His Love Ministries. I knew they were really trying to make a difference in the lives of others by reaching out to those in our prisons and nursing homes.

When I made that first call to Marty McKenzie, he was delighted that I wanted to volunteer and quickly made available to me a name of someone in a nursing care facility that seldom received visitors. You see, her family either had passed away or lived too far away to visit often. I was told very little about her situation (due to privacy laws), but over time I learned about her life. In this process of getting to know her, I've come to admire, respect, and love my new friend. She has a wisdom gained through 82 years of living on this earth and gives me counsel. Her eyes light up when I come in the room, and she is eager just to talk to someone. The rewards of this developing relationship are great.

While the nursing care facility certainly does their best, their stretched resources sometimes makes it difficult for them to spend as much time with each resident as they may desire. Imagine if that were your parent or grandparent sitting there for months on end with no one stopping by to check on them, no one to share stories with, no one to care for them. After 80+ years of pouring their lives into others, are they to come to their end of days without anyone noticing?

I'd like to offer a few tips based on my experience and more than anything, would like to encourage you to adopt a nursing care resident.

- When introducing yourself, explain why you chose to get involved.

- Be careful in asking too many personal questions – let them share their life when they become comfortable with you.
- Make sure to check with the caregiver before bringing any sweets (they may be diabetic.)
- Try to bring them something each time you visit (a magazine, a small treat, a flower)
- Try to notice what they might need and try to fill that need (the birdfeeder was empty just outside her window so I bring birdseed when I visit.)
- Make sure you don't make promises you can't keep (I promised her I would be there one time and discovered I had business travel so couldn't make it.)
- On that note, be consistent...try to visit as often as possible (I try to see her once a week or at least once every two weeks.)
- Be willing to share your life with stories, pictures, etc.
- Be realistic in your expectations – it takes time for a relationship to grow and for trust to be built.
