## Anticipating the Coming of the Lord

The Love of God 2 Thessalonians 2:16-17

## 1. God Has Loved You (v.16a)

Before God created the world He had already chosen who He would bless and who would stand holy and blameless before Him (Eph. 1:1-6). He chose to save us because of His kindness and His love (Eph. 1:4-5; 1 John 4:10). He chose to save everyone who would one day believe in Him even though we were all spiritually dead rebels when He made us alive in Him (Eph. 2:4-7; cf. Rom 5:8). The Lord's love for and desire to bless all who would believe in Him is so great that He came to seek us and to save us (John 3:16; 10:16; Luke 19:10). God chose to love, bless, and save every individual who would believe in Him even though we would continue to sin and fail Him regularly (1 John 2:1-2; cf. John 21:15-17).

## 2. God Has Given You Eternal Comfort and Hope (v.16b)

God has promised to give the joy and peace of eternal life with Him to all who believe in Him (2 Thess. 2:16b; cf. Titus 1:2). He has given us His Word so that we can have sufficient knowledge in order to believe in Christ and be saved (John 20:31) and so that we can be confident that He has saved us (1 John 5:13). He has given us His Spirit as a taste of the fullness of His blessing that we will receive (Eph. 1:13-14). Believers can live and serve Him at ease knowing that God has made peace with us (Rom. 5:1) and we are no longer under the threat of condemnation (Rom. 8:1).

## 3. God Will Comfort and Strengthen You (v.17)

The love which God has given to us and the promises of future our blessings with Him is to encourage us in our faithfulness and obedience to Him (2 Thess. 2:17). The life of faithfulness that Christians are to live is unsurprisingly hard and full of opposition (John 15:20; 1 Pet. 4:12). The more that we understand and experience His love, the more our actions will be controlled by it (2 Cor. 5:14). We can be confident that God will strengthen us in our work as we continually orient our lives around Him and the love which He has shown to us (Gal. 2:20; Phil. 1:21).
