"Feeling Stuck"

Review: Where did the storm come from?

You can only run from God for so long before you are STUCK

Jonah 1:15 So they took up Jonah, and cast him forth into the sea: and the sea ceased from her raging. 16 Then the men feared the LORD exceedingly, and offered a sacrifice unto the LORD, and made vows. 17 Now the LORD had prepared a great fish to swallow up Jonah. And Jonah was in the belly of the fish three days and three nights.

This is his description of being thrown overboard and swallowed by the whale

Jonah 2:3 For thou hadst cast me into the deep, in the midst of the seas; and the floods compassed me about: all thy billows and thy waves passed over me.

Jonah was prepared to die

- There was no more running
- He was STUCK!

This is how he felt:

Jonah 2:1 Then Jonah prayed unto the LORD his God out of the fish's belly, 2 And said, I cried by reason of mine affliction unto the LORD, and he heard me; out of the belly of hell cried I, and thou heardest my voice.

He was miserable

What does it feel like when you run from God?

NOTE: God steps in, but He doesn't just make things go away

God's heart is about changing your heart, not just your circumstances

"I cried by reason of mine affliction"

■ Affliction = anguish, distress, tribulation, trouble

Jonah 2:3 For thou hadst cast me into the deep, *in the midst of the seas*; and the floods compassed me about: all thy billows and thy waves passed over me.

He was overwhelmed

"Lord, I'm drowning"

- In all of my strength, I can't get out
- I can't overcome this

Floods compassed me about = it just won't quit

Jonah 2:5 The waters compassed me about, even to the soul: <u>the depth closed me round about, the weeds</u> were wrapped about my head.

Jonah 2:4 Then I said, I am cast out of thy sight.......

He felt alone

■ In his heart.... "I am alone"

This is truly how he felt

- "Why would God care?"
- "I did this to myself"

Have you ever felt as if God was not listening?

Listen to this description....

Jonah 2:5 The waters compassed me about, even to the soul: the depth closed me round about, the weeds were wrapped about my head. 6 I went down to the bottoms of the mountains; the earth with her bars was about me for ever.....

- Bars prison
- Trapped.....

He felt defeated

Jonah 2:7 When my soul fainted within me...... I remembered the LORD: and my prayer came in unto thee, into thine holy temple.

- Fainted = failed became feeble
 - o "I'm done!"

God had a plan!

His plan might not be what you would plan = A BIG FISH!

Look back....

Jonah 2:1 Then Jonah prayed unto the LORD his God out of the fish's belly,

- Sometimes we have to hit bottom before we look up
- Jonah never cried out to God or prayed in anyway during that great storm
 - He was willing to be thrown overboard, yet he never prayed
 - He was vet not broken

Jonah 2:1 Then Jonah prayed unto the LORD his God out of the fish's belly, 2 And said, I cried by reason of mine affliction unto the LORD, and he heard me; out of the belly of hell cried I, and thou heardest my voice.

Why did he pray this?

Jonah 2:7 When my soul fainted within me......

Jonah hit bottom!

Jonah 2:1 Then Jonah prayed unto the LORD his God out of the fish's belly,

■ This is his first prayer in the entire story....

Go back to chapter 1....

Jonah 1:9 And he said unto them, I am an Hebrew; and I fear the LORD, the God of heaven, which hath made the sea and the dry land.

Just because you have a knowledge of God does not mean you have a relationship with God! Just because you have a spiritual title does not mean you are where you should be with God!

IT'S TIME FOR CHANGE!

Jonah 2:2 And said, I cried by reason of mine affliction unto the LORD, and he heard me; out of the belly of hell cried I, and thou heardest my voice.

Jonah Restored His Relationship

■ This is Jonah crying out to God and God working in Jonah

"God...I'm stuck"

- "God, I've gotten away"
- o "God, I need you..."
- It is, "God...I need you in my life...not just...I need you to fix this"

Jonah Refocused His Attention

Jonah 2:4 Then I said, I am cast out of thy sight; yet I will look again toward thy holy temple.

Jonah, "I messed up, but I'm seeking you!"

God was waiting on THIS!

- "Put your eyes back on me"
- "Put your focus back on me"

"....yet I will look again toward thy holy temple."

- WHY, "again?"
- Because, He got his focus off

Jonah Renewed His Mind

Jonah 2:7 When my soul fainted within me I remembered the LORD: and my prayer came in unto thee, into thine holy temple.

"I remembered the Lord"

- "I serve the living God"
 - I have nothing to FEAR
 - My God is in control

My God is faithful

Jonah Removed His Idols

Jonah 2:8 They that observe lying vanities forsake their own mercy.

- o "They that trust in idols" or "vanities" or "things of this world"
- Forsake their own mercy = "turn their backs on what they need most"

What got you stuck? What got you off track?

Jonah 2:10 And the LORD spake unto the fish, and it vomited out Jonah upon the dry land.

- This was his second chance
- This was a miracle of God

God set him FREE!

- But what happened right before this?
- What was the last part of his prayer?

Jonah 2:9 But I will sacrifice unto thee with the voice of thanksgiving; I will pay that that I have vowed. Salvation is of the LORD.

Jonah Surrendered His Life

What is the last thing he prayed before this happened? "Lord....I'm yours!"

Jonah 2:10 And the LORD spake unto the fish, and it vomited out Jonah upon the dry land.

God is a God of second chances
