The Undeniable Authority of Jesus Christ

Matthew 21:23-27; Selected Scriptures

1. Jesus His Authority

Jesus regularly described His ministry in terms of having been sent from the Father with a job to complete (John 3:34; 5:19-24; 6:38-40). The only time in which the Son exercised His use of divine power was in accordance with the plan and the will of God (Luke 4:1-13; Matt 26:39; cf. Phil 2:7). The very words that He spoke and the works that He did were all in order to complete the specific ministry task for which Christ had been sent (John 14:10, 24, 31).

2. <u>Jesus</u> His Authority

The Son of God demonstrated His unique power and authority throughout His ministry. He routinely exercised healing and restorative power over the natural and supernatural afflictions of men (Matt. 8:16). He exercised mastery over the physical world (Mark 4:35-41) and over its creatures (Luke 5:4-7; cf. Matt 17:27). Jesus demonstrated that His ability to perform the works of God were not limited by the proximity of the afflicted (Luke 7:1ff), the duration of the affliction (John 9:1ff), the extent of the affliction (Luke 7:14; John 11:42), or the timing of the affliction (Mark 8:31; 9:31; 10:34; cf. John 10:18).

3. Jesus His Authority

The Lord Jesus gathered disciples unto Himself, trained them, and sent them out to assist Him in His mission (Mark 6:7, Luke 10:1). Following His resurrection, Jesus commissioned all believers to spread the gospel and to teach every disciple to obey the commands of Christ (Matt. 28:18-20). We have been given the task of properly understanding what God has said (2 Tim. 2:15) so that we might speak and act in accordance with His will (Jas. 2:12). Furthermore, we have the responsibility to confidently proclaim the truth of what God has done (cf. John 20:23).
