Proclaiming the Forgiveness of Sins in His Name

Luke 24:44-49

1. Jesus was _____ as Lord
The writings of the Old Testament are God's inspired and preserved revelation of Himself given to the descendants of Abraham (Acts 7:38; Rom. 3:1). God had promised that He Himself would come in order to accomplish all that He has promised (Ps. 110:1; Zech. 2:8-12). The Lord came as He promised and was rejected by those to whom He gave those promises (Ps. 118:22; cf. Mt. 21:42).
Transition: Comprehending the Truth of God is a Gift of Divine of Mercy (Luke 24:45)

2. Jesus is to be _____ as Lord
Whether by sending a prophet to a foreign people (Jonah 1:1-2) or by bringing foreigners into Israel (2 Ki. 5:3), God's plan has always been to call all men to believe in Him (Isa. 45:22). Through the death and resurrection of Christ God accomplished the forgiveness of sinners (Lk. 24:46-47), and there is no other way that men can be reconciled unto God (Acts 4:12; Jn. 8:24). God sent Christ into the world in order to accomplish salvation and He now sends us into the world in order to proclaim His salvation (Mt. 28:19-20; cf. Jn. 17:14-18).
