Galatians 6:11-18

1. The Poverty of Hypocrisy (Gal. 6:12-13)

The Judaizers who were compelling the Galatian Christians to keep the Law were themselves not keeping the Law. The Galatian believers, and all Christians since, must carefully remember that full obedience to the Law is both impossible and ineffective for earning the favor of God (cf. Luke 17:7-10).

2. The Primacy of the Cross (Gal. 6:14-15)

Paul's theology for all of life is centered around the importance of the work of Jesus Christ on the cross. This is to be our only boast and our primary perspective for life.
