...the doctrinal conflicts and paradoxical issues that have divided the church and perplexed both believers and unbelievers for centuries.

1. God is the creator and sustainer of the universe and of humankind, transcending the universe but immanent in it;

2. God's nature embodies justice and holiness, but He is also a personal and loving God who cares for each creature (so the name 'father' is indeed appropriate);

3. God's nature is revealed most perfectly in the life and teachings of Jesus of Nazareth, as recorded in the New Testament of the Bible. Jesus was sent by God to reveal the divine nature, summarized in 'God is Love;

4. God has an active presence in the world that still touches the lives of the faithful today.

Christians do not claim that their faith gives them omniscience ... But they believe that the Christian account of things—creation, fall, redemption, and restoration—makes the most sense of the world. I ask you to put on Christianity like a pair of spectacles and look at the world with it. See what power it has to explain what we know and see.
