## Podcast Transcript

24-year-old Patrick Rempe had an awesome mustache. He also had

questionable taste in friends. And drugs. And location. Based on the topic of this episode, can you guess which state he's from? Terrible taste in both state of residence and state of inebriation. Because apparently you don't make great decisions when you're a Florida man high on flakka. F-l-a-k-k-a, it sounds like a drug for muppets. "The snuffleupugus has been snuffling some flakka wakka." cheek he had tattooed the words "loyalty's thin" and on the other cheek "betrayal's thick." those were the messages he wanted to broadcast to the world. I guess the real message he was broadcasting was "my parents didn't do a good job." John Morgan the first has

some explaining to do. John Morgan the second plead guilty and received a sentence of three years. He also had to repay the \$6000 he had stolen. Ashley received two years in prison for driving the getaway car. So you know what that means, fellas. Ashley is going to be free and single for at least one year before John gets out. And she makes terrible decisions, so you've probably got a chance. Actually, this all happened back in 2015, so presumably they're back together and on the road to "happily ever after."
