Satisfied in the Sufficiency of God's Provision Selected Scriptures

1. The Sufficiency of Scripture

The Scriptures are the only infallible authority for the Christian faith and xpractice. They are the ultimate authority in determining what is righteous and what is sinful.

- A. The Scriptures alone are God-breathed (2 Tim. 3:16).
- B. The Scriptures are not the product of man's mind (2 Pt. 1:20-21).
- C. The Scriptures are more sure than supernatural experiences (2 Pt. 1:16-19).
- D. The Scriptures are of greater authority than the general knowledge found in <u>creation</u> (Ps. 19:1-7; Rom. 1:18-23).
- E. The Scriptures are the <u>guide</u> by which man can honor God (Ps. 119:9-10; John 17:17).
- F. The Scriptures judge the hearts of men, man is not to sit in judgment over the Scriptures (Heb. 4:12).
- G. The Scriptures, for the most part (2 Pt. 3:16), are able to be <u>comprehended</u> by all people. The Scripture...

 - II. Is Profitable (2 Tim 3:16-17)
 - III. Explains Salvation (2 Tim. 3:15b)

 - VI. Can Be Understood by Children (2 Tim. 3:14-15a)

2. The Sufficiency of Christ

- A. The Sacrifice of Jesus Christ is Sufficient to Reconcile God to <u>Man</u> (Jn. 3:16; Rom. 5:12, 18-19; 2 Cor. 5:20-21; Heb. 7:25; 10:11-14; 1 Pt. 2:24).
- B. The Sacrifice of Jesus Christ is Sufficient to Reconcile Man to <u>Man</u> (2 Cor. 5:16-19; Eph. 2:14-19; cf. Rom. 3:22; 1 Cor. 12:13; Gal. 3:28; Col. 3:11).

3. The Sufficiency of Faith

Salvation is God's gracious gift to man and is received only through faith (Jn. 3:36; Rom. 3:21-26; 4:16; Gal. 2:16, 21; 3:6, 10-11, 23-24; Eph. 2:8-9).
